
On October 9, 1961, this Commission published Order No. 67, establishing taxicab rates and charges for the interstate transportation of persons in the Metropolitan Area Transit District. On November 8, 1961, Henry G. Bartsch, Jennings A. Streifuss, Cabell D. Moody, and H. Lindsay Bachman filed an application in writing requesting a reconsideration of the matters involved in said Order, specifically claiming the Commission erred when it failed to find that it lacked jurisdiction to prescribe and regulate rates for transportation by taxicab between a point in the jurisdiction of the District of Columbia and any point on the Washington National Airport.

The Commission is of the opinion that said Petition for Reconsideration should be denied for the reason that the Commission has fully considered the reasons and issues stated in said Petition and that said Petition does not raise any new reasons or issues not considered by the Commission in publishing said Order.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

That said Petition for Reconsideration be, and it is, hereby denied.
