The Commission is in receipt of creditable information that Montgomery Charter Service, Inc., has been, and is, transporting passengers for hire within the Metropolitan District. Montgomery Charter Service, Inc., does not possess a certificate of public convenience and necessity nor has it filed a "grandfather" application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

The Commission is of the opinion that it should institute an investigation of the operations of Montgomery Charter Service, Inc., in order that it may determine whether Montgomery Charter Service, Inc., has, or is about to, violate Section 4(a) Article XII of the Compact, which provides that:

"No person shall engage in transportation subject to this Act unless there is in force a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by the Commission authorizing such person to engage in such transportation;....."

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That an investigation be made and hearing held concerning such transportation operations.
2. That Montgomery Charter Service, Inc., be, and it is, hereby made a respondent to this proceeding.
3. That the hearing on this matter be held on June 5, 1962, at 9:30 a.m., in the offices of the Commission, 1801 North Moore Street, Arlington, Virginia. That notice of this hearing be given to all interested persons, be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District once, at least ten (10) days prior to said hearing.
