
This matter came before the Commission upon the formal complaint of Archie L. Milling against D. C. Transit System, Inc. The complaint alleges that D. C. Transit System, Inc., is illegally engaged in performing sightseeing operations, by motor vehicle, from points and places in Virginia, without proper authority from this Commission. After due public notice, a hearing was held on the complaint before Delmer Ison, hearing examiner, in the Commission's offices on February 13, 1962. On May 17, 1962, the hearing examiner issued a Proposed Report pursuant to the Commission's rules and regulations and recommended that the Commission enter an order dismissing the complaint.

The Proposed Report of the hearing examiner, including the findings of fact and conclusions of law, is approved and adopted by the Commission as if copied herein in full.

There were no exceptions filed to the examiner's Proposed Report.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the complaint be, and it is hereby, dismissed.
