
The Washington, Virginia and Maryland Coach Company, Inc. has filed an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for authority to operate as a common carrier by motor vehicle of passengers and their baggage, and express and newspapers in the same vehicle with passengers, between Washington, D. C. and Dulles International Airport, near Chantilly, Virginia. The applicant proposes to operate from Washington over city streets connecting highways and Potomac River bridges and over three different routes, namely Interstate Route 66, Virginia Highway Number 7 and the Dulles International Airport Access Highway.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

2. That the applicant publish notice of this hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District at least fifteen (15) days prior to said October 11, 1962.
3. Any person desiring to protest this application shall do so, in writing, at least five (5) days prior to said October 11, 1962.
