An application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity was filed by Joseph A. and Mary Grace Bellosi, t/a M. Grace Line Tours, pursuant to Section 4(a), Article XII, of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Regulation Compact. The application seeks "grandfather" authority for such transportation as they were bona fide engaged in on March 22, 1961, the effective date of the Compact.

The Commission has made numerous attempts to communicate with the applicant, these communications being necessary to process the application. All letters were returned for lack of sufficient address, and the applicant is not listed by the telephone company as a subscriber to its service.

The License Departments of Virginia, Maryland and the District of Columbia on September 21, 1962, revealed that the applicant did not have a single vehicle licensed for operation.

It is the opinion of this Commission that the applicant has ceased all for-hire transportation in the Metropolitan District, that it is his obligation to keep the Commission informed as to his residence or place of business and that the applicant has failed to meet his obligation.


Based on the foregoing, the application should be dismissed and, lacking an address to which notice that this dismissal can be sent, the Chief Clerk of the Commission should publish a copy of this order in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District.
