By Corrected Order No. 255, served May 2, 1963, the Commission granted Landers Tram Service, Inc. temporary authority to conduct a scheduled, regular-route sightseeing operation by motor vehicle serving the Washington Monument, Bureau of Engraving, Jefferson Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, White House, National Art Gallery, and Smithsonian Institute. The temporary authority restricted the applicant to open-sided trailers drawn by separate power units on certain named streets and was effective for a period of one hundred twenty (120) days from May 1, 1963.

On August 13, 1963, the Commission heard the case of Landers Tram Service, Inc., for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (Docket No. 40). No decision has been rendered on this matter.

Applicant has now filed with the Commission a "Motion for Extension of Period of Temporary Authority."

The Commission is of the opinion that the applicant should be allowed to operate until such time as a decision is rendered on its application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the temporary authority granted by Corrected Order No. 255 to Landers Tram Service, Inc. be, and it is hereby, extended an additional sixty (60) days, which is a total of one hundred eighty (180) days, inclusive of May 1, 1963, unless otherwise ordered.
