Application No. 17

On May 16, 1961, A. B. & W. Transit Company filed an application to eliminate mid-day service in the Barcroft Area. This application was accompanied by exhibits setting forth the results of traffic counts made by the Applicant.

Notice of the proposed elimination was posted in the buses affected by the application for 15 days, and no protest was received by the Commission.

The Commission's Engineering Staff was ordered to conduct an investigation into this service and reported that very few passengers used the service, that the service is operated at a loss, and that elimination of this service will enable the Applicant to improve service in other areas where a demand for transportation exists. In effect, the Engineering report supports the data supplied by the Company. In addition, the Company will continue its present rush-hour service to this area.

The Commission is of the opinion that the mid-day service to the Barcroft Area should be eliminated.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

That A. B. & W. Transit Company file a revised time schedule providing for the elimination of mid-day service to the Barcroft Area, to become effective after at least 10 days notice to the public.
