On October 15, 1965, WMA Transit Company filed Application No. 347, requesting authority to establish Route P as follows:

From junction of County Road and Foster Street, over Foster Street, 72nd Avenue, Gateway Boulevard, County Road, Walker Mill Road, Addison Road, Central Avenue, 78th Street, Canyon Drive, 75th Street, Franklin Drive, 78th Street, to Central Avenue and return over the same route.

It is proposed that the service operate as a shuttle in the A.M. and P.M. peak periods only. One bus would be required to operate 17 round trips per day. Route P would serve an area where many new apartment and housing developments have been and are being constructed. The new intra-state route will make connections with established interstate Routes A, B, and J.

The Commission is of the opinion that there is an urgent and immediate need for temporary service, and that a public hearing is required on the permanent authority request.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:**


1. That temporary authority be, and it is hereby, granted WMA Transit Company, effective November 1, 1965, for a period not to exceed one-hundred eighty (180) days, to operate its Route P as described herein.

2. That the request for permanent authority to operate Route P be, and it is hereby, set for hearing on Wednesday, February 2, 1966, at 9:30 A.M. in the offices of the Commission, 1815 North Fort Myer Drive, Arlington, Virginia.

3. That the applicant publish notice of its application, and hearing thereon, in a newspaper of general circulation in the Washington Metropolitan District at least once, twenty-five (25) days prior to February 2, 1966.

4. That any person desiring to protest this application shall do so, in writing to the Commission, with a copy to the Attorney of Record, at least ten (10) days prior to February 2, 1966.
