Establishing Bus Stops and)
Bus Zones on Pennsylvania Avenue)
for D. C. Transit System, Inc. and)
W. M. A. Transit Company)

Since the discontinuance of Barney's Circle as a transfer point, bus zones for D. C. Transit System, Inc. and W. M. A. Transit Company on Pennsylvania Avenue at 15th Street, S.E., Washington, D. C. are inadequate to handle buses westbound in the morning rush hours and eastbound in the evening rush hours.

These bus companies have requested the establishment of a morning rush hour bus stop and 2-bus zone on the north side of Pennsylvania Avenue, west of the existing bus stop at 15th Street, so that two additional buses will be accommodated during the morning rush hours.

The companies further requested the re-location of the bus stop and 3-bus zone on the south side of Pennsylvania Avenue from the west side to the east side of 15th Street and during evening rush hours an additional 2-bus zone at this location.

The requested changes have been investigated by representatives of D. C. Department of Highways and Traffic and the Commission's Engineering Department, and they concur that these changes should be made. It appears that public convenience and necessity require the establishment of these bus stops and bus zones.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That an A.M. rush hour stop and 2-bus zone be established:

On Pennsylvania Avenue, S. E.
North side, west of 15th Street and existing stop.

- (2) That a bus stop and 3-bus zone, and P.M. rush hour stop and 2-bus zone be established:

On Pennsylvania Avenue, S. E.
South side, east of 15th Street


- (3) That the following bus stop and 3-bus zone be abolished:

On Pennsylvania Avenue, S. E.
South side, west of 15th Street
