By Application No. 383, WMA Transit Company requests authority to extend its Route T in Prince George's County, Maryland, as follows:

From the junction of Maryland Route 450 and 57th Avenue, over 57th Avenue, Emerson Street, 58th Avenue, 57th Avenue to Maryland Route 450, thence over regular route.

WMA also requests temporary authority, effective June 20, 1966, to provide this service, pending a hearing on permanent authority, due to the rapid growth of apartment developments in the Mattapony area.

The Attorney of Record in this matter is Stanley H. Kamerow, 1025 Vermont Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20005.

The Commission is of the opinion, and finds, that there is an immediate and urgent need for temporary service to this area, and that the request for permanent authority should be set for public hearing.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:


1. That WMA Transit Company be, and it is hereby, granted ninety (90) day temporary authority to extend its Route T as described herein, effective Monday, June 20, 1966.

2. That the request for permanent authority be, and it is hereby, set for public hearing on Wednesday, July 13, 1966, at 9:30 A. M., in the offices of the Commission, 1815 North Fort Myer Drive, Arlington, Virginia 22209.

3. That applicant publish notice of application, and time and place of hearing thereon, in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, once, at least twenty-five (25) days prior to said hearing.

4. That any interested party desiring to be heard on this matter shall so indicate to the Commission in writing, with a copy to the Attorney of Record, at least ten (10) days prior to said hearing.
