By Application No. 379, Washington, Virginia and Maryland Coach Company requests temporary authority to change its Route 11 in the area sometimes known as Green Valley as follows, effective July 5, 1966:

Discontinued Portion:

Kenmore Street - Between Walter Reed Drive and Shirlington Road

Shirlington Road - Between Kenmore Street and 25th Street

(NOTE: Routes 8-N and 10 will continue to operate via Kenmore Street and Shirlington Road)

Rerouted Portion:

Outbound - Over regular route to the intersection of Walter Reed Drive and Kenmore Street, thence continue westerly on Walter Reed Drive, south on Oakland Street, east on 24th Road, Lowell Street and 25th Street to its intersection with Shirlington Road, thence continue over regular route.

Inbound - Over regular route to the intersection of Shirlington Road and 25th Street, thence westerly on 25th Street, Lowell Street and 24th Road, north

on Oakland Street, easterly on Walter Reed Drive to its intersection with Kenmore Street, thence continue Walter Reed Drive and regular route.

Notice of the application and hearing thereon was published pursuant to order.

Based upon the evidence adduced at the hearing on June 30, 1966, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that there is an immediate and urgent need for the service and that there is no carrier service available in the area sought to be served. The Commission further finds that temporary authority should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the application of the Washington, Virginia and Maryland Coach Company for temporary authority to change its Route 11, as hereinabove described, for one hundred eighty (180) days be, and it is hereby, granted.
2. That this order become effective Monday, July 11, 1966.
