By application accepted for filing September 29, 2005, WMATC Carrier No. 512 requests that the name on its certificate of authority be changed from Quality Medical Supplies LLC, trading as F & J Healthcare Services, to Quality Medical Transportation LLC, trading as F & J Healthcare Services.

Applicant is a Maryland limited liability company. In support of its request, applicant has submitted a copy of the certificate of amendment issued by the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation certifying applicant's change of legal name from Quality Medical Supplies LLC to Quality Medical Transportation LLC.

Under Title II of the Compact, Article XI, Section 10(b), the Commission may amend a certificate of authority upon application by the holder. Simple name change requests may be granted on good cause shown.¹ For good cause shown, the application shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That upon applicant's timely compliance with the requirements of this order, Certificate of Authority No. 512 shall be reissued to Quality Medical Transportation LLC, trading as F & J Healthcare Services, 1806 Saint George's Way, Mitchellville, MD 20721.

2. That applicant may not transport passengers for hire between points in the Metropolitan District pursuant to this order unless and

until a certificate of authority has been issued in accordance with the preceding paragraph.

3. That applicant is hereby directed to present its revenue vehicle(s) for inspection and file the following documents within the 180-day maximum permitted in Commission Regulation No. 66: (a) evidence of insurance pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 58 and Order No. 4203; (b) an original and four copies of a tariff or tariffs in accordance with Commission Regulation No. 55; (c) a vehicle list stating the year, make, model, serial number, fleet number, license plate number (with jurisdiction) and seating capacity of each vehicle to be used in revenue operations; (d) a copy of the for-hire vehicle registration card, and a lease as required by Commission Regulation No. 62 if applicant is not the registered owner, for each vehicle to be used in revenue operations; and (e) proof of current safety inspection of said vehicle(s) by or on behalf of the United States Department of Transportation, the State of Maryland, the District of Columbia, or the Commonwealth of Virginia.

4. That the grant of authority herein shall be void and the application shall stand denied upon applicant's failure to timely satisfy the conditions of issuance prescribed herein.
