By application accepted for filing November 18, 2005, America Transportation Services, Inc., a Maryland entity, seeks a certificate of authority for irregular route operations between points in the Metropolitan District.

This is the second application filed by this applicant. Applicant applied earlier this year for a certificate of authority, but the application was denied without prejudice for failure to establish regulatory compliance fitness.<sup>1</sup>

Applicant proposes commencing operations with two minibuses. Applicant's proposed tariff contains hourly group charter rates and one-way rates for transportation to and from Ronald Reagan Washington National and Washington-Dulles International Airports.

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit and whether the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than December 28, 2005, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.

2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than January 11, 2006, an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

3. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing is January 11, 2006, and that copies must be served on applicant's
