Commission Regulation No. 58 requires respondent to insure the revenue vehicles operated under Certificate No. 290 for a minimum of \$1.5 million in combined-single-limit liability coverage and maintain on file with the Commission at all times proof of coverage in the form of a WMATC Certificate of Insurance and Policy Endorsement (WMATC Insurance Endorsement) for each policy comprising the minimum.

The \$1.5 million primary WMATC Insurance Endorsement on file for respondent expired March 12, 2006, and has not been replaced. Certificate No. 890, therefore, is automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-02. In addition, respondent has neither paid the \$150 annual fee for 2006 nor filed its annual report for 2005/2006.

Under Regulation No. 67-03, respondent now owes \$250 in late fees: \$50 for failure to timely file an acceptable WMATC Insurance Endorsement; \$100 for failure to timely file an annual report for 2005/2006; and \$100 for failure to timely pay the annual fee for 2006.


Respondent shall have thirty days to file the necessary Insurance Endorsement(s), submit an annual report, and pay the annual fee and all late fees, or face revocation of Certificate No. 890.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That respondent shall not transport passengers for hire under Certificate No. 890, unless and until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

2. That within thirty days, respondent shall file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s), submit an annual report for 2005/2006, and pay by money order, certified check, or cashier's check the sum of \$400, or show cause why Certificate No. 890 should not be revoked pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact.
