By application accepted for filing April 7, 2006, James Harold Walker, a sole proprietor trading as Watts Transpotion, seeks a certificate of authority for irregular route operations in vehicles with a seating capacity of less than 16 persons only, including the driver.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with one van. Applicant's proposed tariff contains rates for transportation under the District of Columbia Medicaid program as well as per capita rates for one-way and round-trip transfers.

Because applicant's principal place of business is in the District of Columbia, applicant will be directed to file proof of trade name registration with the DC Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs.

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit and whether the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:


1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than May 3, 2006, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.

2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 17, 2006, an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

3. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 17, 2006, proof of trade name registration with the District of Columbia Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs.

4. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing is May 17, 2006, and that copies must be served on applicant's representative, Willie Walden, 115 Elmira Street, S.W., Washington, DC 20032.
