Commission Regulation No. 58 requires respondent to insure the revenue vehicles operated under Certificate No. 1080 for a minimum of \$1.5 million in combined-single-limit liability coverage and maintain on file with the Commission at all times proof of coverage in the form of a WMATC Certificate of Insurance and Policy Endorsement (WMATC Insurance Endorsement) for each policy comprising the minimum. Under Regulation No. 67-03(c), \$50 is due and payable upon the failure of a carrier to timely file an acceptable WMATC Insurance Endorsement.

The \$1 million primary and \$1 million excess WMATC Insurance Endorsements on file for respondent expired on May 18, 2008, and have not been replaced. Certificate No. 1080, therefore, is automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-12 and may be revoked if respondent fails to file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) and pay the \$50 late fee within thirty days.

In addition, respondent's only tariff is for service rendered to clients of the District of Columbia Department of Health, Medical Assistance Administration (MAA). These rates are no longer operative now that MAA has assigned all transportation contracts to Medical Transportation Management, Inc. Respondent, therefore, must file a new tariff in accordance with Regulation Nos. 55 and 56, and pay the \$50 filing fee pursuant to Regulation No. 67-01.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That respondent shall not transport passengers for hire under Certificate No. 1080, unless and until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

2. That Certificate No. 1080 shall be subject to revocation pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact, if respondent fails to file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s), submit a new tariff, and pay \$100 by money order, certified check, or cashier's check, within thirty days.
