By letter dated May 7, 2008, applicant was directed to publish notice of this application in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District no later than May 21, 2008, and file an affidavit of publication, proof of federal passenger carrier operating authority, and a current certificate of good standing from the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation (MDAT) no later than June 4, 2008.

Applicant produced a certificate of good standing from MDAT, but it is not current because it is more than six months old.¹ In addition, applicant has produced neither an affidavit of publication nor proof of federal passenger carrier operating authority.

Under the Compact, an application to obtain a certificate of authority shall be made in writing, verified, and shall contain the information required by the application form and accompanying instructions.² An applicant may be required to publish notice of the application in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District and furnish any supplemental information necessary for a full and fair examination of the application.³ Failure to comply with the Commission's application requirements warrants dismissal.⁴

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: that the application of D.T.S. Worldwide Transportation, LLC, for a certificate of authority is hereby dismissed without prejudice for want of prosecution.
