By petition filed March 4, 2009, Glory Medtrans Inc., (GMI), requests a suspension of Certificate No. 1518 for an indefinite period of time. GMI States that it is no longer in business but might want to resume operations in the near future. In the meantime, at GMI's request, GMI's insurance company has cancelled GMI's \$1.5 million WMATC Insurance Endorsement effective March 23, 2009.

The Commission may suspend a certificate of authority under Title II of the Compact, Article XI, Section 10(b), upon application by the holder. Once a carrier's WMATC Endorsement has been cancelled, however, the Commission requires that the carrier file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) within thirty days or face revocation of its operating authority.¹

Accordingly, the request for suspension is granted, but Certificate No. 1518 may be revoked if respondent fails to file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) within thirty days.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That respondent shall not transport passengers for hire under Certificate No. 1518, unless and until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

2. That Certificate No. 1518 shall be subject to revocation pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact, if respondent fails to file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) within thirty days.
