By letter dated December 3, 2010, applicant was notified of acceptance of its application for a certificate of authority. The acceptance letter noted that the \$250 application fee was paid by check drawn on the joint account of Bernard A. Randall and Wanda M. Randall and gave applicant 14 days to file a statement explaining the relationship between applicant and these persons.

On December 17, 2010, the Commission received a statement that purports to be the statement of applicant. The statement explains that applicant and Mr. Randall are co-workers at Diamond Transportation. The signature on the statement, however, does not match applicant's signature on the application and on her Virginia driver's license attached to the application. And the statement is not under oath as required by Commission Rule No. 4-06.

Under the Compact, an application to obtain a certificate of authority shall be made in writing, verified, and shall contain the information required by the application form and accompanying instructions.¹ An applicant may be required to furnish any supplemental information necessary for a full and fair examination of the application.² Failure to comply with the Commission's application requirements warrants dismissal.³

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: that the application of Mina Lama for a certificate of authority is hereby dismissed without prejudice for want of prosecution.
