This matter is before the Commission on respondent's response to Order No. 12,342, served March 25, 2010, directing respondent to show cause why respondent should not be required to obtain for-hire license plates for its vehicles, and on the revocation of Certificate No. 333 in Order No. 12,796, served April 8, 2011.

The Commission determined in Order No. 12,342 that respondent's vehicles registered with the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration were not registered with a for-hire class code. The order accordingly directed respondent to show cause why respondent should not be required to re-register its vans. Respondent responded that it desired to retain its handicapped license plates. Commission staff informed respondent how that could be done in a way that complied with Order No. 12,342. The Commission has received no further response.

In the meantime, Certificate No. 333 became automatically suspended on January 1, 2011, for respondent's willful failure to comply with the insurance requirements specified in Regulation No. 58. Order No. 12,681, served January 4, 2011, noted that Certificate No. 333 would be subject to revocation if respondent failed to file the necessary insurance endorsement(s) and pay a \$50 late fee within thirty days. Respondent failed to file the necessary insurance endorsement(s) and pay the late fee. Accordingly, Certificate No. 333 was revoked in Order No. 12,796, served this day.¹

Inasmuch as respondent no longer holds WMATC authority, this investigation is hereby terminated.
