This matter is before the Commission on respondent's failure to comply with Order No. 13,115, served January 11, 2012, granting respondent's request for an installment plan to pay a \$1,750 civil forfeiture. The order stipulated that respondent would be permitted to pay the \$1,750 in two installments of \$600 each and one installment of \$550. The first two were due on the first of February 2012 and the first of March 2012, respectively. The third was due on the first of April 2012. Respondent has made only one payment, \$500 on March 21, 2012.

The forfeiture was assessed in Order No. 12,723, served February 15, 2011. Respondent applied for reconsideration under Rule No. 27, and the Commission granted the application in Order No. 12,802, served April 8, 2011, for the limited purpose of receiving evidence of respondent's financial results of operations conducted during the time period in which respondent committed the violations at issue so that the Commission might consider reducing the forfeiture or approving an installment plan. Respondent produced its evidence, and the Commission found in Order No. 13,115 that although no reduction of the forfeiture was warranted, an installment plan would be permitted, as noted above.

Order No. 12,723 stated that Certificate No. 206 would be subject to suspension and revocation if respondent failed to timely pay the forfeiture. Accordingly, respondent shall have 30 days to show cause why the Commission should not suspend or revoke Certificate No. 206 for respondent's knowing and willful failure to timely pay the forfeiture assessed in Order No. 12,723, as modified by Order No. 13,115.
