On July 13, 2012, the Commission issued a letter notifying applicant of acceptance of his application for a certificate of authority. The letter was returned by the U.S. Postal Service on July 16, 2012, because applicant had moved and the forwarding order had expired.

On July 18, 2012, the Commission sent an email to applicant giving applicant "14 days to file a signed written statement with our office (not e-mail) explaining this." The email cautioned that applicant's failure to timely comply might result in delay or dismissal. Applicant filed a statement on July 20, 2012, but the statement is not signed as required by the Commission's email and Commission Rule No. 4-05. Applicant has filed no further statement.

Under the Compact, an application to obtain a certificate of authority shall be made in writing, verified, and shall contain the information required by the application form and accompanying instructions.¹ An applicant may be required to furnish any supplemental information necessary for a full and fair examination of the application.² Failure to comply with the Commission's application requirements warrants dismissal.³

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: that the application of Gordon I Ettienne, trading as Etco, for a certificate of authority is hereby dismissed without prejudice for want of prosecution.
