An application for a certificate of authority submitted by a corporation or limited liability company must be signed by officer. The instant application was submitted by Andres Martinez, who is identified in the application as applicant's manager.

By e-mail dated November 1, 2012, applicant was directed to provide, no later than November 15, 2012, a copy of the document naming Mr. Martinez manager. The e-mail cautioned applicant that failure to timely furnish the information would result in delay or dismissal of the application. Applicant has yet to respond.

Under the Compact, an application to obtain a certificate of authority shall be made in writing, verified, and shall contain the information required by the application form and accompanying instructions.<sup>1</sup> An applicant may be required to publish notice of the application in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District and furnish any supplemental information necessary for a full and fair examination of the application.<sup>2</sup> Failure to comply with the Commission's application requirements warrants dismissal.<sup>3</sup>

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: that the application of A-1 American Limousine, LLC, for a certificate of authority is hereby dismissed without prejudice for want of prosecution.
