Commission Regulation No. 58 requires respondent to insure the revenue vehicles operated under Certificate No. 2355 for a minimum of \$5 million in combined-single-limit liability coverage and maintain on file with the Commission at all times proof of coverage in the form of a WMATC Certificate of Insurance and Policy Endorsement (WMATC Insurance Endorsement) for each policy comprising the minimum. Under Regulation No. 67-03(c), \$100 is due and payable upon the failure of a carrier to timely file an acceptable WMATC Insurance Endorsement.

The \$5 million primary WMATC Insurance Endorsement on file for respondent was canceled on January 28, 2014, effective March 4, 2014, and replaced with a \$1.5 million primary on January 31, 2014, effective March 4, 2014. The \$1.5 million Endorsement was canceled on March 13, 2014, effective April 17, 2014, and replaced with a \$1.5 million primary on March 25, 2014, effective April 17, 2014. Finally, the second \$1.5 million Endorsement was canceled on April 10, 2014, effective May 15, 2014, and has not been replaced. Certificate No. 2355, therefore, stands automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-12 as of March 4, 2014, and may be revoked if respondent fails to file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) and pay the \$100 late fee within 30 days.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That respondent shall not transport passengers for hire under Certificate No. 2355, unless and until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

2. That Certificate No. 2355 shall be subject to revocation pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact, if respondent fails to file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) and pay \$100 by money order, check, or online by credit card, within thirty days.
