Commission Regulation No. 58 requires respondent to insure the revenue vehicles operated under Certificate No. 1527 for a minimum of \$1.5 million in combined-single-limit liability coverage and maintain on file with the Commission at all times proof of coverage in the form of a WMATC Certificate of Insurance and Policy Endorsement (WMATC Insurance Endorsement) for each policy comprising the minimum.

The \$1.5 million primary WMATC Insurance Endorsement on file for respondent terminated on September 10, 2014, without replacement. As a result, Certificate No. 1527 was automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-12, and a \$100 late insurance fee became due and payable under Regulation No. 67-03(c), as noted in Order No. 15,047, served September 10, 2014.

Respondent filed an acceptable \$1.5 million primary WMATC Insurance Endorsement on September 16, 2014, and tendered a \$100 check on October 20, 2014. Accordingly, the suspension is lifted, and this investigation is terminated.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup> This decision lifts the suspension of respondent's existing WMATC authority, which is restricted to transportation in vehicles seating 15 persons or less, including the driver. The Commission has conditionally approved respondent's application to remove the 15-person restriction. *In re CLM Limo. Serv. Inc.*, No. AP-14-169, Order No. 14,865 (June 20, 2014), but respondent has yet to satisfy all conditions. Respondent therefore may not operate any vehicles seating more than 15 persons until such time as respondent has satisfied all conditions stipulated in Order No. 14,865 and Certificate No. 1527 has been reissued without any seating capacity restriction.
