This matter is before the Commission on the failure of respondents to respond to Order No. 16,027, served December 7, 2015. That order assessed a \$250 civil forfeiture against several carriers, including respondents, for knowingly and willfully violating Article XI, Section 14, of the Compact and Commission Regulation No. 55 by transporting passengers in 2015 for Medical Transportation Management, Inc., without a valid contract tariff on file with WMATC.¹ Each respondent was directed to pay a \$250 civil forfeiture to the Commission within 30 days. Respondents have yet to respond.

In accordance with Article XI, Section 10(b), of the Compact, each respondent shall have 30 days to show cause why the Commission should not revoke each respondent's certificate of authority for willful failure to pay the forfeiture assessed in Order No. 16,027.

¹ Order No. 16,027 also directed respondent Medical Transportation Systems (MTS) LLC, WMATC No. 2630, to cease and desist performing any passenger transportation for Medical Transportation Management, Inc., until such time as an acceptable contract tariff covering such service is filed with the Commission and in effect. This respondent has yet to file such a contract tariff. Therefore, the cease and desist directive remains in effect.
