On July 1, 1970, we issued Order No. 1055, authorizing D. C. Transit System, Inc., to suspend the sale of bus tokens and commutation tickets. This action was necessitated by problems which arose in connection with token sales following the stay of our Order No. 1052, which authorized an increase in D. C. Transit's fares.

On July 1, 1970, we also issued our Order No. 1057 denying petitions for reconsideration and reinstating the increased fares effective at 12:01 A.M., Saturday, July 11, 1970. Action was then instituted in the U. S. Court of Appeals seeking a stay of Order No. 1052. On July 10, 1970, the court denied a stay. Hence, the new fares become effective tomorrow. Thus, there is no further reason to continue the suspension of token sales.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of sales of tokens and commutation tickets authorized by Order No. 1055 be, and it is hereby, revoked, effective 12:01 A.M., Saturday, July 11, 1970.
