Payne v. WMATC, 415 F2d 901 (D.C. Cir. 1968) directed this Commission to study methods of cost allocation for D. C. Transit System, Inc., in order to determine whether Transit's fare structure is unduly discriminatory.


Commission Order No. 941, issued April 18, 1969, approved engaging the independent consulting firm of Alan M. Voorhees and Associates, Inc., to conduct this study on a time and materials contract. Orders Nos. 941 and 983 authorized expenditures toward the project which culminated in a 60-page report entitled "Report on the Relationship of Fares, Services and Costs for D. C. Transit System, Inc."

Order No. 1013, issued February 13, 1970, set a prehearing conference for a public hearing to assist the Commission in reaching conclusions about what effect to give to this study. In order to facilitate meaningful public participation in this hearing, members of the Voorhees firm should be available to explain their methodology and findings at both the prehearing conferences, and the hearings themselves.

Pursuant to Article XII, Section 19 of the Compact, we will assess D. C. Transit System, Inc., for the cost of the Voorhees participation in these hearings.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that D. C. Transit System, Inc.,
be, and it is hereby, assessed \$5,000 which it is directed to
deposit in the name and to the credit of the Washington
Metropolitan Area Transit Commission in the American Security
and Trust Company, 1612 K Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.,
on or before August 17, 1970.
