By motion filed February 20, 1976, Tri-State Limousine Service (Tri-State) seeks to withdraw its application filed December 18, 1975, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity, as described in Order No. 1489, served January 16, 1976.

The matter has been scheduled for public hearing on March 3, 1976. On January 29, 1976, the Metropolitan Washington Airport Service notified the Commission that it believed the current service between Washington National Airport and Dulles International Airport was adequate and there was no need for any additional service between those points. On February 13, 1976, Greyhound Airport Service, Inc. (Greyhound) filed a formal protest to the application. Counsel for Greyhound has indicated that protestant will interpose no objection to the motion to withdraw the application.

The Commission does not believe that the public interest will be adversely affected by permitting Tri-State to withdraw its application.


THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

2. That Application No. 899 of Tri-State Limousine Service be, and it is hereby, dismissed without prejudice.

3. That the public hearing scheduled for March 3, 1976, by Order No. 1489, served January 16, 1976, be, and it is hereby, cancelled.
