By petition filed December 17, 1976, the above-named applicant seeks leave expansively to amend Application No. 964 so as to include the transportation in charter operations pursuant to contract of persons who are outpatients of the National Institutes of Health, over irregular routes:

(a) For weekend shopping trips between the United Inn of America, 8130 Wisconsin Avenue, Bethesda, Md., on the one hand, and, on the other, shopping areas at Montgomery Mall, White Flint Mall, Bethesda, Chevy Chase, Silver Spring, and Wheaton, Md., and the Friendship Heights area of the District of Columbia, and

(b) For field trips on an irregular basis of six times per year between the United Inn of America, 8130 Wisconsin Avenue, Bethesda, Md., on the one hand, and, on the other, the monument area and the Georgetown area of Washington, D. C., Mt. Vernon, Old Town Alexandria, and Arlington Cemetery, Va., Cabin John Regional Park and Wheaton Regional Park, Md., and Rock Creek Park in the District of Columbia and Montgomery County, Md.

This service would be provided pursuant to a contract with the National Institutes of Health, as would the shuttle service originally proposed. See Order No. 964, served November 18, 1976.

The Commission will accept the amendment to the application, and the application as amended will be the subject of a public hearing to commence Tuesday, February 8, 1977, at 9:30 A. M. in the Hearing Room of the Commission, Room 314, 1625 I Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20006. See Order No. 1637, served December 16, 1976.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:


1. That Application No. 964 of Shaw Enterprises, Inc., trading as United Inn of America be, and it is hereby, amended in the manner set forth above.

2. That Shaw Enterprises, Inc., publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District and post continuously until the hearing date in each of its vehicles notice of the amendment and hearing in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission no later than Wednesday, January 5, 1977, and present at the hearing a certificate of publication from the selected newspaper and a certificate of posting.

3. That any person desiring to protest said amendment shall file a protest in accordance with Commission Rule 14, or any person desiring to be heard on this matter shall notify the Commission, in writing, on or before Wednesday, January 26, 1977, and shall mail a copy of such protest or such notice to counsel for the applicant, Sherman L. Cohn, Esquire, Georgetown University Law Center, Washington, D. C. 20001.

4. That in all other respects Order Nos. 1628 and 1636, served November 18, 1976, and December 16, 1976, respectively, shall remain in full force and effect.
