By Order No. 1861, served July 7, 1978, James M. Smith, Inc., was directed to file certain evidence with the Commission no later than July 14, 1978. Temporary authority granted in said order was to become effective on July 17, 1978, and continue in effect through January 12, 1979.

By motion (letter) filed July 12, 1978, Smith seeks a one-week extension of the above-referenced compliance date, citing as its reason administrative problems in scheduling required inspections of the motor vehicles to be used in the authorized operation. For good cause shown, the motion shall be granted and the effective dates of the temporary authority shall also be postponed for seven days.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the time fixed for compliance in Order No. 1861 is hereby extended until Friday, July 21, 1978.

2. That the temporary authority granted in said Order No. 1861, shall be effective Monday, July 24, 1978 and shall continue in effect for a period of 180 days until Friday, January 19, 1979, at 11:59 p.m., unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.

3. That in all other respects Order No. 1861 shall continue in full force and effect.
