
By Order No. 1940, served December 12, 1978, this proceeding was instituted to determine if Bannister Enterprises, Inc. (Bannister), was rendering reasonable, continuous and adequate service pursuant to that portion of Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 32 authorizing charter operations pursuant to contract to transport persons designated by Amtrak, and their baggage in the same vehicle with passengers, between Colonial Parking Garage, 400 North Capitol Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and the facilities of Amtrak at or near Union Station, Washington, D. C., restricted to service rendered pursuant to a continuing contract or contracts between Bannister and Amtrak. Bannister's most recent contract with Amtrak expired December 31, 1977.

On December 15, 1978, Bannister filed a request that its authority to serve Amtrak be terminated. In support of this motion, Bannister states that Amtrak no longer has funds to contract for the above-described service. For good cause shown, Bannister's motion shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the above-described operating rights are hereby terminated.
2. That an appropriately revised certificate of public convenience and necessity be issued to Bannister Enterprises, Inc., concurrently with service of this order.
3. That in all other respects, Case No. MP-78-17 is hereby dismissed.
