By motion filed February 1, 1979, International Limousine Service, Inc., seeks partial revocation of its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 38. In support of the motion, International states that its contract to transport employees of the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission expired on September 30, 1978. Budgetary problems, which to date remain unresolved, have prevented CPSC from renewing the contract. In the event a new contract should someday be awarded to International, it would seek new authority.


For good cause shown, the motion shall be granted.
