
Order No. 2015, served August 7, 1979, inter alia, required applicant "to file with the Commission . . . notice that its equipment is properly outfitted with wheelchair tie-downs and safety equipment and is available for inspection . . ." within 45 days, "or such further time as may be authorized"

On September 17, 1979, applicant advised that it had been unable to locate the particular piece of equipment it had intended to acquire, but that applicant had entered an agreement with "UMTA Program, 16[B]2" (presumably the Urban Mass Transportation Administration of the U. S. Department of Transportation) for an alternative unit with hydraulic lift and wheelchair tie-downs. Applicant states that the condition of the vehicle and equipment is being evaluated and that compliance by September 21, 1979, will not be possible. Applicant requests an extension of 30 days to meet the requirements of the Commission.

For good cause shown, applicant's time for compliance shall be extended through October 21, 1979. In all other respects, Order No. 2015 shall remain in full force.
