In Case No. AP-80-12, David C. Pearson trading as E & H Transportation Company (Pearson), filed a motion on June 26, 1980, seeking an extension of time in which to comply with the provisions of Order No. 2114, served May 27, 1980. That order, granting authority to perform special operations between points in Washington, D. C., and the District of Columbia Department of Corrections facility at Lorton, Va., requires Mr. Pearson to file copies of an appropriate WMATC tariff and notice that his vehicles are available for inspection. Inasmuch as Mr. Pearson has been advised that delivery of recently purchased vehicles will take approximately 45 days, he requests an extension for that time period. The Commission will grant an extension of 45 days for Mr. Pearson to comply with the provisions of Order No. 2114.

In Case No. AP-80-04, protestant Ironsides Medical Transportation Company (Ironsides) seeks a postponement of the hearing scheduled for July 3, 1980. Protestant states that its sole witness scheduled to appear at the hearing has been subpoenaed to testify in a court proceeding on July 3, 1980, and is therefore unavailable. The hearing will be rescheduled accordingly.


THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That in Case No. AP-80-12, David C. Pearson trading as E & H Transportation Company is hereby granted 45 days from the service date hereof to comply with the provisions of Order No. 2114.

2. That in Case No. AP-80-04, the public hearing is hereby rescheduled to commence on Thursday, August 7, 1980, at 9:30 a.m.

3. That in all other respects, Order Nos. 2114 and 2115 remain in full force and effect.
