

The Commission assessed against D. C. Transit System, Inc., ("Transit") \$150,000 in 1974, 1/ and another \$5,000 in 1975 2/ to cover the estimated costs of the above-captioned proceedings. These funds were deposited in an escrow account at American Security Bank. Transit paid into this escrow account an additional \$4,911 for extra remand work undertaken at Transit's behest and expense. As of December 31, 1981, this escrow account had earned interest of \$3,692.97, for a total of \$208,603.97. The United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit has confirmed the Commission's assessments ". . . insofar as the Commission acted as our instrumentality in the equitable distribution of the fund to be restored." 3/

Through December 31, 1981, the Commission has expended \$207,879.26 from this account, leaving a balance on hand of \$724.71. The Commission anticipates additional expenses in connection with these proceedings and finds it necessary to assess an additional amount against Transit to cover those expenses.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that D. C. Transit System, Inc., is hereby assessed \$5,000 which it is directed to deposit in the name and to the credit of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Commission Escrow Expense Account in the American Security Bank, 1612 K Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., on or before March 30, 1982.
