By application filed September 7, 1982, International Limousine Service, Inc. (International), seeks authority to operate pursuant to WMATC Special Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 1 under a contract with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), a branch of the U. S. Department of Energy, transporting employees of that Commission and persons on official government business, between FERC facilities at (1) 400 First Street, N. W., and 825 North Capitol Street, and (2) the above two points and 12th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., all points in the District of Columbia, on a regularly scheduled basis. Inasmuch as the application proposes the transportation of government employees and the contract is for a period of one year, the application appears generally to be amenable to processing under Commission Regulation No. 70. */

The contract between International and FERC calls for a daily service over two routes on a regular schedule Monday through Friday among the above-named points. Applicant operates mini-bus equipment pursuant to a WMATC certificate and has operated van equipment pursuant to government contracts. This contract calls for use of two vans seating at least 14 passengers and applicant has designated two 14-passenger vans for the provision of service with a similar vehicle as back-up equipment. The contract price is \$184.80 for each day of service for both routes. Applicant failed to provide a projection of

revenue and revenue deductions as required by paragraph number 7 of the application. It will be directed to supplement its application accordingly. International's parent company submitted consolidated financial statements for the year ended December 31, 1981.

International Limousine states that it has experience operating employee shuttle transportation, and that it is familiar with the rules, regulations and requirements of the Commission and will comply therewith. A contracting officer for FERC submitted an affidavit supporting the application and stating that it has investigated the applicant and is satisfied with applicant's ability properly to perform the proposed service. A certificate of insurance consistent with Commission Regulation No. 62 is on file with the Commission.

Pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 70-06, notice of this application must be published and opportunity given for the filing of protests. Protests, if any, must be written, sworn and notarized, and must contain all evidence and argument upon which the protestant would rely.


THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That International Limousine Service, Inc., publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, notice of this application in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission no later than Friday, September 10, 1982.

2. That applicant shall file an affidavit of such publication and the supplemental material described above with the Commission no later than Wednesday, September 15, 1982.

3. That any person desiring to protest this application shall file a notarized protest in conformance with Commission Regulation No. 70-06 at the office of the Commission, Suite 316, 1625 I Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20006, no later than Monday, September 20, 1982, and shall simultaneously serve a copy of such protest on Jere W. Glover, Esquire, Price & Glover, 1001 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., Suite 1201, Washington, D. C. 20036.
