By application filed March 1, 1984, Transportation Consultants, Inc., an Arizona corporation trading as Air Courier Ground Transportation Services ("TCI" or "applicant"), seeks authorization to conduct charter operations pursuant to WMATC Special Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 1 under a contract with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC"), transporting employees of NRC and persons traveling on official business with NRC, over irregular routes, (A) between the Willste Building, 7915 Eastern Avenue, Silver Spring, Md., and 5650 Nicholson Lane, Rockville, Md., serving specified intermediate points, and (B) between the Phillips Building, 7920 Norfolk Avenue, Bethesda, Md., and 1717 H Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., serving no intermediate points.

Order No. 2536, served March 6, 1984, generally describes the evidence submitted with the application, and that order is incorporated by reference herein. The Commission required publication of notice and the filing of an affidavit of publication and other specified material. Applicant complied with these requirements, and no protests to the application were received by the Commission within the time set therefor.

Commission Regulation No. 70 provides that an application of this type will be granted if it is determined that the applicant is fit, willing and able properly to perform the proposed service and to conform to the provisions of the Compact and the rules, regulations and orders of the Commission thereunder, and if it is determined that the proposed operations conform to the provisions of Regulation No. 70. The issue of whether the public convenience and necessity requires such service has been determined in Case No. MP-79-04. See Order No. 2004, served June 20, 1979.


Inasmuch as the contract is for a fixed term of at least 181 days and provides for the transportation of employees pursuant to a contract with their employer, the Commission finds that this

application conforms to the requirements of Commission Regulation No. 70. It is further found, based on the evidence of record as described in Order No. 2536, that applicant is fit, willing and able properly to provide the service described above and to conform to the requirements of the Compact and the rules, regulations and orders of the Commission thereunder.

Applicant is assigned WMATC Authorization No. 107, is directed to identify its vehicles in accordance with Commission Regulation No. 70-10, is directed to file an affidavit of compliance with that regulation, and is further directed to file two copies of the executed contract, all not later than Thursday, March 29, 1984. Upon compliance, an appropriate authorization will be issued.
