By Order No. 2889, served July 29, 1986, we granted this joint application to transfer Certificate No. 25 from Beltway Limousine Service, Inc. ("Beltway" or "transferor"), to DD Enterprises, Inc. ("DD Enterprises" or "transferee"). Transferor Beltway sought reconsideration, and we reopened the case 1/ for the limited purpose of reassessing the financial fitness of transferee, which Beltway had called into question. The matter was scheduled for hearing. Each party was assessed hearing costs and ordered 2/ to produce certain documentary data prior to hearing in order to assure that the Commission would have sufficient evidence to dispose of the issue at hand. DD Enterprises paid its hearing assessment and provided the required data. Beltway did not comply with these requirements and filed a motion to withdraw its petition for reconsideration. This filing, according to Beltway, "rendered moot" the scheduled hearing. The hearing was canceled and the matter submitted to us either for our decision or for directions as to what further proceedings we might require.

We hold that a public hearing is unnecessary. As this matter now comes to us, no party takes issue with the financial data submitted by DD Enterprises, and no party opposes the transfer of Certificate No. 25.

Beltway's brief flare of reluctance having burned out, we have reexamined DD Enterprises' financial fitness by our own light. This time, looking at seven months' operations rather than three, we see that transferee has increased business in its dominant revenue category, contract work. In this regard, it appears to be doing steady business with reliable clients. DD Enterprises projects that increased revenues from this source together with reductions in its indirect costs will enable it to earn a profit in the future. Although



transferee has sustained an operating deficit for the first seven months of operations, the funds to finance this deficit have come primarily from the owners as infusions of working capital. On reconsideration, we affirm our prior decision that transferee DD Enterprises, Inc., is financially fit to conduct operations pursuant to Certificate No. 25.

Our approval of the transfer of Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 25 from Beltway Limousine Service, Inc., to DD Enterprises, Inc., is hereby reinstated in accordance with the terms of Order No. 2889, and Certificate No. 25 shall forthwith be issued to DD Enterprises, Inc., whereupon the temporary authority issued to DD Enterprises, Inc., by Order No. 2903 shall stand terminated.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
