The Commission's records show that Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 90 was issued to James Warren Dickens for the purpose of transporting passengers in special operations, lectured, round-trip sightseeing tours.

By letter received June 15, 1987, Mr. Dickens' insurance broker advised the Commission that Mr. Dickens is deceased and, therefore, his insurance has been cancelled. According to procedure, the Commission will suspend Certificate No. 90 and provide 30 days to show cause why it should not be revoked.


THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the above-captioned proceeding is instituted pursuant to Title II, Article XII, Section 4(g) of the Compact to determine whether Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 90 issued to James Warren Dickens shall be revoked.

2. That Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 90 issued to James Warren Dickens is hereby suspended until further order of the Commission.

3. That any party at interest is directed within 30 days of the date of this order to show good cause, if any there be, why Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 90 should not be revoked in its entirety.
