By application filed April 4, 1988, On-Time American Transport, Inc. ("On-Time" or "applicant"), seeks authority pursuant to WMATC Special Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 1 to transport employees of All Nippon Airways and persons traveling on official business with All Nippon Airways in charter operations pursuant to contract with ANA Hallo Tours (U.S.A.), Inc., a subsidiary of All Nippon Airways. A regularly scheduled shuttle would serve the Grand Hyatt Hotel, the Capital Hilton Hotel, the Westin Hotel, the Washington Hilton Hotel, the Sheraton Washington Hotel, Georgetown, Capitol Hill, the Lincoln Memorial, the Jefferson Memorial, the Smithsonian Museums, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (all located in the District of Columbia); and Arlington and Alexandria, Va.

Order No. 3144, served April 7, 1988, generally described the evidence submitted with the application, and that order is incorporated by reference herein. The Commission required publication of notice, the filing of (a) an affidavit of publication; (b) leases pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 69; and (c) certificates of registration and inspection pertaining to all vehicles to be used in the proposed service. Applicant complied with these requirements and no protests to the application were received by the Commission within the time set therefore.

Commission Regulation No. 70 provides that an application of this type will be granted if it is determined that the applicant is fit, willing, and able to perform the proposed service properly and to conform to the provisions of the Compact and the rules, regulations, and orders of the Commission thereunder, and if it is determined that the proposed operations conform to the provisions of Regulation No. 70. The issue of whether the public convenience and necessity requires such service has been determined in Case No. MP-79-04. See Order No. 2004, served June 20, 1979.


Inasmuch as the contract is for a fixed term of at least 181 days and provides for the transportation of persons traveling on official business of the contractor and for the transportation of

employees pursuant to contract with their employer, the Commission finds that this application conforms to the requirements of Commission Regulation No. 70. It is further found, based on the evidence of record as described in Order No. 3144, that applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to provide the service described above and to conform to the requirements of the Compact and the rules, regulations, and orders of the Commission thereunder.

A valid certificate of insurance is on file with the Commission. Upon On-Time's filing of (a) two tariff cover sheets for its WMATC Tariff No. 2 pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 52 and (b) an affidavit of identification pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 70-10, an appropriate authorization will be issued.
