By Order No. 3267, served December 19, 1988, Perkins Ambulance and Wheelchair Service, Inc. (Perkins), was directed to file certain materials and pay an assessment no later than January 19, 1989. Perkins failed to respond to these requirements in any way. By Order No. 3298, served March 6, 1989, Perkins was directed to show cause why its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 126 should not be suspended or revoked for failure to comply with Order No. 3267. Again Perkins failed to respond in any manner.


The Compact, Title II, Article XII, Section 4(g) provides, in pertinent part:

. . . no certificate shall be revoked (except upon application of the holder) unless the holder thereof wilfully fails to comply, within a reasonable time, not less than 30 days, to be fixed by the Commission, with a lawful order of the Commission commanding obedience to the rules or regulations or orders of the Commission

We find that Perkins Ambulance and Wheelchair Service, Inc., has wilfully failed to comply within the meaning of Section 4(g). Nor has the company ever offered any explanation for such failure. Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 126 issued to Perkins Ambulance and Wheelchair Service, Inc., is hereby revoked, effective this date.
