By application filed March 1, 1991, supplemented March 4, 1991, and amended March 5, 1991, ADV International Corporation, trading as Moran Limousine Service (ADV or applicant), a District of Columbia corporation, seeks temporary authority to transport passengers in irregular route operations between points in the Metropolitan District for the account of Potomac River Front Limited Partnership (the partnership).

The partnership owns a project known as Washington Harbour at 3000 and 3050 K Street, N.W., Washington, DC. The transportation to be provided for the partnership consists of a scheduled shuttle service for Washington Harbour tenants. Only persons with a valid bus pass may ride the shuttle. The proposed transportation would require three vehicles operating designated services between 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. Two would be 1991 model 25-passenger vehicles, and one would be a 1991 model 21-passenger vehicle. The vehicles will be owned by the applicant.


The application contains, among other things, information regarding applicant's finances, the vehicles to be used, the vehicle maintenance program and facilities, and minimum driver requirements. The application also contains a certificate of support from the Property Manager of Washington Harbour.

The standards for temporary authority are set forth in the Compact at Title II, Article XI, Section 13. The essential elements are an immediate need for service that is not available and fitness of the applicant. See Order No. 2864, served May 12, 1986; and Order No. 1643, served January 24, 1977.

This order will provide notice of ADV's application for temporary authority, and a brief period will be provided for the filing of protests, if any. No extension of time will be granted. The application is available for inspection at the office of the Commission during its regular business hours.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that any person wanting to protest this application shall file a protest in accordance with Commission Rule No. 13 and Regulation No. 54-04(a) at the office of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Commission, 1828 L Street, N.W., Suite 703, Washington, DC 20036-5104, no later than Friday, March 15, 1991, and shall simultaneously serve a copy of such protest on applicant's representative, Ms. Shirley Moran, 3000 K Street, N.W., Suite 130, Washington, DC 20007.
