By application filed November 26, 1991, American Services International Company (ASI or applicant), a Virginia corporation, seeks a Certificate of Authority to transport passengers, together with mail, express and baggage in the same vehicles as passengers, in irregular route operations between points in the Metropolitan District, restricted to transportation in vehicles with a manufacturer's designed seating capacity of 15 or fewer persons, including the driver.

ASI proposes to initiate operations using one of two vehicles it owns having a manufacturer-designed seating capacity of 11 passengers each. Applicant's proposed tariff contains rates for hourly charter service and transfer charter service.

ASI's application includes information regarding, among other things, its corporate status, facilities, vehicle maintenance arrangements, proposed tariff, finances, and regulatory compliance record. The application is available for inspection at the office of the Commission during its regular business hours.

ASI's application is missing the required director and stockholder information, and its balance sheet, Exhibit E, contains entries which require further explanation or correction. ASI, accordingly, is directed to address these matters as ordered below.

In determining whether to grant or deny an application for a Certificate of Authority, the Compact at Title II, Article XI, Section 7 requires that the Commission determine whether an applicant is fit, willing, and able to perform that transportation properly and conform to the provisions of the Compact and the Commission's rules, regulations, and requirements and that the transportation is consistent with the public interest. Pursuant to Commission Rule No. 6, this order and fulfillment of its requirements will provide notice of ASI's application for a Certificate of Authority.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That American Services International Company shall file with the Commission, no later than Tuesday, December 17, 1991, an original and four copies of (a) the names and business addresses of all of its directors, and (b) the names and business addresses of five principal stockholders or shareholders, and their respective holdings.

2. That American Services International Company shall file with the Commission, no later than Tuesday, December 17, 1991, an original and four copies of a supporting schedule or other explanation showing how it calculated the Liabilities and Stockholder's Equity entries on the balance sheet attached to its application as Exhibit E. An original and four copies of an amended Exhibit E may be filed in lieu thereof.


3. That American Services International Company shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission, no later than Monday, December 16, 1991.

4. That American Services International Company shall file with the Commission, no later than Monday, January 6, 1992, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

5. That any person wanting to protest the issuance of a Certificate of Authority to American Services International Company shall do so in accordance with Commission Rule No. 13 and Regulation No. 54-04(a), and any person wanting to comment on this matter, other than by protest, shall do so in writing, in accordance with Regulation No. 54-04(a), by filing such protest or comment at the office of the Commission, 1828 L Street, N.W., Suite 703, Washington, DC 20036-5104, no later than Monday, January 6, 1992, and shall simultaneously serve a copy of such protest or comment on applicant at 5383 Essex Court, Suite 251, Alexandria, VA 22311.

6. That any person seeking a formal oral hearing on this matter shall request one in accordance with Commission Regulation No. 54-04(b) no later than Monday, January 6, 1992, and shall simultaneously serve a copy of such request on applicant at 5383 Essex Court, Suite 251, Alexandria, VA 22311.
