The certificate of insurance on file for Lancaster Enterprises, Inc., trading as Dial-of-Wheels Shuttle (Lancaster), expired July 11, 1992. By Order No. 3969, served July 13, 1992, and incorporated herein by reference, Lancaster's Certificate of Authority No. 155 was suspended. This proceeding was instituted pursuant to the Compact, Title II, Article XI, Section 10 to determine whether Certificate No. 155 should be revoked. Lancaster was directed within 30 days to comply with Title II, Article XI, Section 7(f) of the Compact and Commission Regulation No. 58. Lancaster was further directed to file within the same 30-day period and appropriate certificate of insurance or other evidence to show good cause why Certificate of Authority No. 155 should not be revoked.

The time for submitting a new WMATC certificate of insurance or other pertinent evidence elapsed on August 12, 1992, without a filing of any type by Lancaster. Thus, pursuant to the authority of Title II, Article XI, Section 10 of the Compact, Certificate of Authority No. 155 will be revoked for failure to comply with both a lawful order and regulation of the Commission.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Certificate of Authority No. 155 issued to Lancaster Enterprises, Inc., trading as Dial-of-Wheels Shuttle, is hereby terminated, effective this date.

2. That Lancaster Enterprises, Inc., trading as Dial-of-Wheels Shuttle, is hereby directed to remove from its vehicle(s) the identification placed thereon pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 61.

3. That Lancaster Enterprises, Inc., trading as Dial-of-Wheels Shuttle, shall file with the Commission, within 30 days of the date of this order, a notarized affidavit that it has complied with the requirements of the preceding paragraph.
