By application accepted for filing May 4, 1995, Huntemann Ambulance Service, Incorporated, a District of Columbia corporation, seeks a certificate of authority for irregular route operations in the Metropolitan District in vehicles with a seating capacity of less than 16 persons only, including the driver.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with two vans owned by applicant. Applicant's proposed tariff contains flat rates for transportation of the handicapped, including rates for transportation under the DC and Maryland Medicaid programs. According to existing tariffs on file with the Commission, applicant's proposed tariff does not agree with the existing Medicaid rates paid in the DC metropolitan area. Applicant will be directed to file an amended Exhibit D containing proposed Medicaid rates which reflect the rates actually paid by DC and the applicable local jurisdictions in Maryland.

Applicant further will be directed to file an amended Exhibit G showing projected depreciation expense for the two vans.


This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit and whether the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than May 22, 1995, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.
2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than June 12, 1995, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.
3. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 22, 1995, an original and four copies of an amended Exhibit D containing proposed Medicaid rates which reflect the rates actually paid by DC and the applicable local jurisdictions in Maryland.
4. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 22, 1995, an original and four copies of an amended Exhibit G showing projected depreciation expense for the two vans.

3. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing, is June 12, 1995, and that copies must be served on applicant's Vice-President, Mr. Mike Huntemann, 5732 Georgia Avenue, N.W., Washington, DC 20011.
