These proceedings were initiated on August 4, 1999, in Orders Nos. 5673 and 5674 as a result of respondent's failure to file an annual report for 1998 and pay an annual fee for 1999. Order No. 5673 granted respondent thirty days to file the annual report and either pay a civil forfeiture of \$100 or show cause why a civil forfeiture should not be assessed. Order No. 5674 granted respondent thirty days to pay the annual fee and a \$100 civil forfeiture.

Each order further provided that respondent's certificate of authority would be automatically suspended if respondent failed to comply within thirty days, and that upon such suspension, respondent would have thirty days to show cause why that authority should not be revoked.

More than sixty days have passed, and respondent has neither complied with the initial orders in these proceedings nor shown cause why Certificate No. 28 should not be revoked.

Accordingly, respondent's certificate of authority shall be revoked pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact for respondent's willful failure to comply with Articles IV and XII of the Compact, Regulations Nos. 60 and 67, Order No. 3601, and the orders in these proceedings.


THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Certificate of Authority No. 28 is hereby revoked.

2. That respondent is hereby directed to remove from its vehicle(s) the identification placed thereon pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 61.

3. That respondent is hereby directed to file within 30 days from the date of this order a notarized affidavit verifying that respondent has complied with the preceding paragraph.
