Case No. AP-99-87

Applicant seeks a certificate of authority to transport passengers in irregular route operations between points in the Metropolitan District, restricted to transportation in vehicles with a seating capacity of less than 16 persons only, including the driver. The application is unopposed.

The Compact, Title II, Article XI, Section 7(a), authorizes the Commission to issue a certificate of authority if it finds that the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest and that the applicant is fit, willing, and able to perform the proposed transportation properly, conform to the provisions of the Compact, and conform to the rules, regulations, and requirements of the Commission.

Applicant proposes operating three sedans under a contract with the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA). The contract requires applicant to operate a reservation system for the benefit of disabled individuals participating in WMATA's MetroAccess program and to ensure that program participants receive timely and adequate transportation service. The MetroAccess program is WMATA's means of complying with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990,<sup>1</sup> which in pertinent part prohibits discrimination against the disabled by public transportation providers. Service under the contract is scheduled to commence January 15, 2000, and requires transportation of program participants between points in the Metropolitan District.

Much, but not all, of the transportation service will be subcontracted out to four current WMATC carriers<sup>2</sup> and one carrier that has applied for temporary and permanent WMATC authority.<sup>3</sup> The subcontractors will operate vehicles furnished by applicant.

We already found applicant fit, willing and able in the course of granting applicant temporary authority in Order No. 5783.<sup>4</sup> We now find that the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest. Accordingly, we shall approve this application. Applicant's temporary authority shall expire upon the issuance of a certificate of authority pursuant to this order, but no later than the time provided in Order No. 5783.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:


1. That upon applicant's timely compliance with the requirements of this order, Certificate of Authority No. 524 shall be issued to LogistiCare Solutions, LLC, trading as LogistiCare, 1895 Phoenix Blvd., Suite 306, College Park, GA 30349, and the temporary authority granted in Order No. 5783 shall expire.

2. That applicant may not transport passengers for hire between points in the Metropolitan District pursuant to this order unless and until a certificate of authority has been issued in accordance with the preceding paragraph.

3. That applicant is hereby directed to file the following documents within thirty days: (a) an original and four copies of a tariff or tariffs in accordance with Commission Regulation No. 55; and (b) a notarized affidavit of identification of vehicles pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 61.

4. That the grant of authority herein shall be void, and the application shall stand denied, upon applicant's failure to timely satisfy the conditions of issuance prescribed herein.
