By application accepted for filing June 21, 2000, Hubert Jefferson Burrill, a sole proprietor, seeks a certificate of authority for irregular route operations in vehicles with a seating capacity of less than 16 persons only, including the driver.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with one van. Applicant's proposed tariff contains rates for transportation under the DC Medicaid program and rates for transportation not funded by Medicaid.

Applicant proposes doing business under the trade name, "Burrill's Wheelchair Transportation Service." Applicant's principal place of business is in Maryland, and under Maryland law, a person must register a fictitious trade name with the Maryland State Department of Assessments and Taxation (SDAT) prior to conducting business under that name.¹ Accordingly, applicant shall be directed to file proof of registration of the trade name, "Burrill's Wheelchair Transportation Service," with the SDAT in accordance with Maryland law.

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit and whether the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than July 7, 2000, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.


2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than July 28, 2000, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

3. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than July 28, 2000, five copies of proof of registration of the trade name, "Burrill's Wheelchair Transportation Service," with the Maryland State Department of Assessments and Taxation, in accordance with Maryland law.

4. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing, is July 28, 2000, and that copies must be served on applicant at 2472 Kenbrook Court, Waldorf, MD 20603.
