
This proceeding was initiated on September 18, 2001, in Order No. 6358 (initial order) as a result of respondent's failure to file an annual report for 2000. The order stated that respondent's certificate of authority would be automatically suspended if within thirty days respondent failed to file the report and either pay a \$100 civil forfeiture or show cause why a civil forfeiture should not be assessed. The order further stated that upon such suspension, respondent would have thirty days to show cause why respondent's authority should not be revoked. More than sixty days have passed since the initial order was issued, and respondent has neither complied with the order nor shown cause why Certificate No. 259 should not be revoked.

Accordingly, respondent's certificate of authority shall be revoked pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact for respondent's willful failure to comply with Article XII, Section 1(a), of the Compact, Regulation No. 60-01, and the initial order in this proceeding.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Certificate of Authority No. 259 is hereby revoked.
2. That respondent is hereby directed to remove from its vehicle(s) the identification placed thereon pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 61.
3. That respondent is hereby directed to file within 30 days from the date of this order a notarized affidavit verifying that respondent has complied with the preceding paragraph.
